- 1 **Training Challenges at TechSavant Technologies Pvt. Ltd.** CO3 [K₆]
- TechSavant Technologies Pvt. Ltd., an emerging IT services company based in Hyderabad, India, specializes in providing software solutions and IT consulting to clients across various industries. Founded five years ago, the company has experienced rapid growth, expanding its client base and workforce. With over 1,000 employees, including developers, quality analysts, project managers, and consultants, TechSavant is focused on maintaining a competitive edge in the ever-evolving IT sector. However, despite its growth, the company is facing significant challenges related to its training and development programs. One of the primary concerns at TechSavant is the lack of structured and effective training for new employees, particularly in technical roles. The company relies heavily on a "learn on the job" approach, where employees are expected to quickly adapt to project requirements without sufficient formal training. This has resulted in a steep learning curve for new recruits, especially in specialized areas like cloud computing, AI, and data analytics. Employees have voiced their dissatisfaction with the training process during internal surveys, citing the inconsistent training programs and lack of mentoring as major concerns. Many new hires, especially fresh graduates, report feeling overwhelmed by the complexity of their roles and the pressure to perform without a clear understanding of the necessary skills and tools. While senior employees often help by providing informal guidance, there is no standardized approach to onboarding or training. Another critical issue is the inadequate upskilling programs for existing employees. As the technology landscape rapidly changes, employees struggle to keep up with emerging technologies like machine learning, blockchain, and advanced data analytics. The company's training initiatives are primarily reactive, focusing only on immediate project needs rather than providing comprehensive, forward-thinking skill

development. As a result, employees feel they are not getting enough opportunities to advance their skills, leading to frustration and lower job satisfaction.

TechSavant's management team is concerned that these training challenges are contributing to higher employee turnover, especially among the younger workforce. Many employees have left the company to join competitors offering better training programs and career development opportunities. In addition, the lack of skill development is affecting the company's ability to take on more complex projects and scale effectively, limiting its growth potential.

To address these issues, TechSavant's leadership has proposed a series of changes to its training approach. These include implementing a structured onboarding program, introducing blended learning methods (a mix of online courses, workshops, and hands-on training), and creating specialized skill development tracks for emerging technologies. The company is also exploring partnerships with external training providers and online platforms like Coursera and LinkedIn Learning to offer employees access to up-to-date, high-quality content. Despite these plans, several challenges remain. The HR and Learning & Development (L&D) teams are understaffed, and there is resistance from some senior leaders who feel that the company's current approach is sufficient. Additionally, the cost of implementing a comprehensive training program could put a strain on the company's budget. Therefore, TechSavant's management must carefully balance the need for skill development with the company's financial and operational constraints.
